	reported.
	• It was informed that the institute has become a network institute of the IIRS outreach programme
	and an institute level coordinator has been appointed for this activity.
	• The constitution of Universal Human Values & Professional Ethics Cell in the Institute was
	reported for the information of the IQAC.
	• The participation of the institute in the TEQIP-III initiative for student training on Future Skill
	Technologies through online mode by faculty trained at IITs was reported.
Item-2	To notify the commencement of an Advance Academic Session in Virtual Mode w.e.f 15 th July

	> The house appreciated the initiatives of Institute, dedication and hard work of faculty members
	to provide leading role in the state of Madhya Pradesh for online teaching, assessment &
	evaluation in the COVID-19 pandemic situation. House also recognized the need to run an
	advance semester in digital mode so that the students can complete their academic requirements
	within the stipulated time, without loss of semester due to following facts:
	• The institute has sincerely tried to address the needs of students from different socio-
	economic strata.
	• Care has also been taken to avoid overburdening of the students and faculty in the name of
	digital learning.
	• The advance semester for all UG & PG classes (except I year) was stared from 15 th July 2020
	in online mode and the detailed Action Plan for Digital Teaching-Learning including
	conduction of (i) Theory Classes (ii) Practical Classes (III) Weekly evaluation & (iv) Mid-
	semester evaluation, all in digital mode was uploaded.
	• The guidelines for digital teaching learning were prepared and circulated well in
	advance on 26 th June 2020.
	• An in-house workshop on "Digital Teaching-Learning & Evaluation" was also conducted
	on 25 th July 2020 for the faculty members of the institute before the commencement of the
	virtual semester.

	 Though online/digital education cannot replace conventional classroom teaching there are certain advantages, such as (i) It offers flexibility of 'anytime anywhere' learning to the students.
	(ii) The students can learn "in their own time, at their own place and at their own
	<u>pace</u> ".
	<i>(iii)</i> The digital content generated can be augmented easily.
	(iv) Audio, video and multimedia resources can be easily integrated
	(v) The online lectures are conducted in an interactive manner using available platforms
	(vi) The lecture sessions are recorded & uploaded for ready availability to students.
	(vii) The students can expand their intellectual horizon and devote energy in learning the
	use of tools and skills which may not have been possible in the traditional teaching
	environment.
	The house also emphasised the regular monitoring of online teaching-learning activities through feedback system and proper record of each theory/Lab class (recording) should be maintained at Institute level.
Item-3	To discuss & review the Digital Action Plan drafted by customizing the PRAGYATA guidelines issued by the MHRD
	The Dean (Academics) of the Institute has appraised the house regarding guidelines as implemented at MITS for digital teaching according to PRAGYATA guidelines. The PRAGYATA guidelines issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India for digital education, include eight steps of online education that is,
	 Plan, Review, Arrange, Guide, talk, Assign, Track, and Appreciate. Dean academics has informed the house that institute has prepared a weekly digital learning
	& assessment plan and it was circulated vide order no 44 dated 16 th July 2020 as per
	following guidelines implemented in the Institute:
	(1) Synchronous Mode: This is online collaborative learning through video conferencing or interactive online class using zoom, Google meet or similar other platforms.
	(2) Asynchronous Mode: This learning happens when the teacher & students are not connected in real time, for example when learning or communication is through e-mails, whatsapp
	groups, SMS or MOODLE. (A) On-line Mode: Learning in this mode can be of the following types:
	Flipped class: Teachers ask students to study the shared learning material before coming to online class and then discuss and ask questions during the interactive class conducted through video conferencing platforms.
	 Regular online class: The faculty conducts the regular scheduled classes through any of the
	 chosen online platforms. ➤ Live class: The interactive online class is conducted through any learning management
	system(LMS), students interact with teacher during the class, all learning material,
	assignments etc are shared through the LMS.
	(B) Semi-off-line Mode: Learning in this mode is being facilitated for students who have problems with internet connectivity or bandwidth and hence who can't attend scheduled classes.
	 Classes. Classes are recorded and uploaded on Youtube with link on MOODLE. The students, who don't have continuous access or bandwidth to attend all scheduled classes, can download the video lectures/demonstrations/ simulations/other learning material/ assignments etc.
	• The students send their queries/assignments through e-mails or what's app to the teachers.
	• Once a week an on-line interactive additional class is scheduled for explaining concepts and answering students' queries.
	• Question-answer model will be used. Along with notes faculty is providing solutions of

assignments. > The students representative Mr. Kunal Abhishek, has provided the feedback on online teaching-learning practices adopted in the Institute, and appreciated the availability of course & lecture material on Institute MOODLE/Youube as this can be utilized by the students as and when required (24x7) as per availability of proper internet connections and electricity in rural areas specially. He also shared the experience about examination portal adopted in the Institute as most of the students of Institute have appreciated the examination portal due to customized facility in the software and user friendliness of portal. The students representatives have given a overall rating on teaching-learning and assessment process of Institute as 10 out of 10 on the basis of teachers cooperation, in some cases it can be 09 out of 10 just due to internet issues at students end. The students representatives have also recognized that, the online system is much better as \geq no disturbance is observed during classes and students can utilize more time for personality development and employability skills development after three to four hour online classes. Shri. Prashant Mehta, IAS, Member, Board of Governors and other external members • have congratulate the Director, Dean (Academics) and other faculty members of Institute for the successful planning and implementation of online teaching-learning & assessment & examination activities during COVID-19 pandemic. 	 A zoom meeting of allUG class coordinators of Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Electronics & CSE/IT departments with the Dean Academics was conducted on 6th August 2020 from 4.30 PM to 6.00 PM.
	3. The class coordinators were instructed to conduct a virtual counselling session for the
	students to find out their concerns during the present digital teaching-learning era due to
	COVID-19. The Dean Academics presented the "Digital Teaching-learning Action Plan" and
	the "Anywhere Anytime Learning Format" being adopted at present. The coordinators
	were asked to motivate the students to be regular so that they face less difficulty during
	examination.
	4. The class coordinators were also asked to conduct a meeting of the faculty members
	involved with their class to discuss their specific experiences, difficulties encountered in
	conducting the online classes and laboratories and take suggestions if any.
	5. The coordinators and respective faculty members discussed and deliberated on "how to
	ensure that students are attentive in the interactive digital classroom". The Dean
	Academics suggested that a small quiz of 2-3 minutes on MOODLE can be conducted randomly during the class and the responses which get stored in an excel sheet can be used
	for attendance.
	6. Based on discussion, the class coordinators and faculty members classified all UG students
	into 3 categories; The fast digital learners were those students who were found to attend
	almost all classes (2-3 per week per course), appear for all quizzes and were submitting all
	assignments regularly. (The classification was based on the digital presence & capabilities
	only)
	7. The medium level digital learners were those students who are attending at least one
	online class per course per week, and submitting assignments regularly and appearing for
	quizzes (at least 50% of assigned/conducted).(irrespective of marks obtained)
	8. The slow digital learners were those students who are not attending any online classes or

attending less than 10% of classes, and not submitting assignments/quizzes or submitting/appearing for less than 10 % of assigned/conducted. (irrespective of marks obtained)

- **9.** The **slow digital learners** are encouraged to attend at least the **additional classes(01 per week per course)** and **submit assignments, appear for quizzes.** If they do so, their attendance is counted and they can progress and move along with the academic session.
- **10.** During the counselling sessions the class coordinators noted down the student queries and submitted these along with their reports,
- **11.** These FAQs regarding Academics, Exams, Fees, Placements, Internships etc. collected based on queries of students communicated through the class coordinators, were addressed and posted on the MOODLE for ready reference to the students and faculty.
